COVID-19 Temperature Screening Plan

Procedure When Temperature Exceeds 100.3

1. Effective April, 2020, All (Contractor) employees, workers, consultants, visitors, escorts, bus drivers, company officials, airport personnel, inspectors, etc. will be subject to a (Contractor) temperature screening prior to entering the project at (specified locations.) (Attach map of screening areas below)
2. Step 1: While observing social distancing guidelines, two wellness screeners will be located at land side tents for initial screening. During the screening process, anyone presenting with a temperature above 100.3 F will be escorted to the second tent for further screening.
3. Step 2: Secondary testing will consist of three additional no-touch thermometer readings for the average temp. In addition, the employee will complete a CDC questionnaire.
4. Once the questionnaire and secondary readings are completed the employee will be directed to contact their supervisor if an elevated temperature is confirmed. In the event the secondary scans are negative, permission will be granted to enter the project.
5. If the secondary scan shows an elevated temperature, the employee(s) will be provided direction in writing to remain at home until they have a non-elevated (normal) temperature for 72 hours without the use of fever reducing medication.

Time spent at the screening will be compensated as time worked, and workers covered under a project PLA that are turned away will be compensated per the Show-Up pay provision of the PLA.

6. Contractors shall assist workers to ensure they access paid leave when directed to remain home.
7. If an employee states they feel sick, we recommend they get evaluated at an off-site facility.
8. After being scanned and allowed to enter, workers must proceed directly to work area. Once at work area, the workers will adhere to the approved site specific COVID-19 safety plan.
9. Each day the process starts over.
10. Refer any questions or concerns to the individual supervisor or (COVID-19 Supervisor).
